## Principal's Report

### Disco

The Year 6 students and teachers have been busy preparing for the disco on Friday the 25<sup>th</sup> May. The Year 6 students have requested their parents provide catering for the night. Information and order slips have been sent home with students. Student leaders have been requested to stay during the first session to help supervise younger students.

### Parent-Teacher Interviews

This Semester's Parent-Teacher interviews will take place on Tuesday and Wednesday of Week 4 using the full PTO booking system. The full booking system simplifies the process for parents however it required extensive involvement from the school in order to get the system ready for parents. As the school strives to improve their processes, any feedback from the parent community would be welcomed.

### NAPLAN Online

Students in Year 3 and 5 have completed their first online assessments with the remaining to be completed over the next week. The school's surface pros and infrastructure has held up well with the initial testing being completed relatively smoothly.

West Morley is eligible for funding from the new school device program. The program provides schools with the opportunity to enhance integration of ICT in classrooms through improved device management and device to student ratios. The school will be looking to use this funding to replenish some of the current surface pros which were acquired under the NAPLAN Online Trial funding received in 2015.
